2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes :

1. Field visits to milk dairy, sewage plant, water purification and supply plants and rural/urban health centers are organized.
2. Students are involved in conducting Continuing Nursing Education programmes, seminar, workshops and conferences, with the use of A.V aids like LCD, projector, flannel board, slide projector and over head projector.
3. Nursing procedures are taught through the demonstration technique in the laboratory; re-demonstration is taken and then the student is permitted to perform at the bedside.
4. The College examines the feedback of various courses from students which is undertaken by the Class and annual basis.
Formative subject evaluation is conducted by the subject teacher periodically.
Students also evaluate teachers at the end of academic year.
5. The faculty and students keep pace with the recent development in the various subjects by referring to journals, magazines, attending conferences, seminars, workshops and online resources. There are department libraries for the use of faculty and students which are updated every year with new books and research materials. The Post graduate students are encouraged to conduct clinical research and the findings are applied into the clinical and community settings.
